Context: Students are required to complete 10 ECTS credits in Context. Students can choose from a range of 2 ECTS to 5 ECTS credit courses from a Context Courses Pool, comprising of Languages and General Education courses.

IM students are required to have a **minimum of 5 ECTS** Context Credits in **foreign languages**.

Context Credits can be accumulated throughout the study programme, starting from the 3rd semester. However, students going abroad in the 3rd semester can take **preparatory language courses** already in the 2nd Semester.
